Doping Control during the World championship 2011

During the World Championship 2011 in Emmeloord & Urk (Netherlands), there will be In competition test according to FMJD's 2009-Netherlands and 2010-Mali (Executive Board Meeting) and in line with our Doping Rules (see Articles 5, 5.1 and 5.7). Only the urine test will be conducted during this tournament, there will not be blood test this time.

Article 5

“All Players under the jurisdiction of a *National Federation* shall be subject to *In-Competition Testing* by FMJD, the *Player's National Federation*, and any other *Anti-Doping Organization* responsible for *Testing* at a *Competition* or *Event* in which they participate. All *Players* under the jurisdiction of a *National Federation*, including *Players* serving a period of ineligibility or a *Provisional Suspension*, shall also be subject to *Out-of-Competition Testing* at any time or place, with or without advance notice, by FMJD, WADA, the *Athlete's National Federation*, the *National Anti-Doping Organization* of any country where the *Player* is present, the IOC during the Olympic Games, and the IPC during Paralympic Games. *Target Testing* will be made a priority.

Article 5.1

The FMJD Medical Committee reserves the right to drawing up the test distribution plan and to arrange random doping tests during all qualifying and final draughts games in accordance with Article 4 of the *International Standard for Testing*, and for the implementation of that plan, including overseeing all *Testing* conducted by or on behalf of FMJD. *Testing* may be conducted by members of the FMJD Medical Committee or by other qualified persons so authorized by FMJD.

Article 5.7

FMJD executive shall have the responsibility to decide at which *International Events* the Anti doping test shall be performed. The FMJD Medical Committee shall determine the number of finishing placement tests, random tests and target tests to be performed.

The following *Players* shall be tested for each *Competition* at an *International and National Events*.

All players for an individual/teams championship that do not involve more than twelve participants/teams or one *Player* selected at random from each of the teams. The top three *Players* or one random player from the top three teams plus five *Players* selected randomly from the remaining participants or one random player from five randomly-selected teams remaining in the individual/teams championship that involve more than twenty participants/teams.

Also during the competition where the Anti doping test shall be performed, any player/team who wins five or more successive games shall be tested.

And Finally *Players* shall be selected for *Out-of-Competition Testing* by the FMJD and by *National Federations* through a process that substantially complies with the *International Standard for Testing* in force at the time of selection. "



Who will conduct/perform the Doping Test?

During this World championship 2011, the testing will be performed by FMJD Medical committee. Mr Oumar Thiero (Chairman) will be assisted by Mr. Daan van Os (Member) for the collection of the urine sample A and sample B from the athletes.

How many players will be tested? and what selection method will be used?

A total of four players will be tested during the World Championship 2011. The selection method will be as follow:

- Two players will be randomly selected from all the participants to be tested during the competition for the test.
- From the ½ finalists (Males, Women) or from the four top players before the last four (or three) rounds, two players will be randomly selected for the test.

What laboratory can do the analysis?

The sample should be sent to an accredited laboratory from WADA for the analysis. Approximately, the laboratory will send the result of the test back within three to four week.

The sample will be screened for stimulants, for narcotics, for B-blockers, for diuretics, for anabolic agents, including endogenous steroids, for cannabis, for B2-agonists, for hormone antagonists and modulators, for hCG (males only) and for glucocorticosteroids using the methods in their accreditation scope.

Who will pay the cost of Doping test?

FMJD will be responsible for all the charges related to the doping test for this competition.

When the test will be performed?

This is an “in competition test”, the test will performed during the WC 2011. The urine sample will be collected from the selected players before they start (or after) the game at the test day during the WC 2011.
